What a rollercoaster the past 18 months have been! We have survived 3 National lockdowns and are now adjusted to the impact that Covid 19 has on our daily lives. What has shone through all of this is Daventry's resilience and the amazing community spirit and selflessness of volunteers, voluntary organisations and local business. During the past 18 months Daventry Town Council (DTC) has undergone many changes including responsibility and the management of our playgrounds and open spaces, cemeteries and market. DTC are working with Norse to continuously manage the environmental services contract to ensure these areas and services are well maintained and enhanced.

The town was buzzing at the Spring Market held in June, and people were responsibly observing distancing rules. We also hosted further organised Community Picks as part of our ongoing Litterheroes Campaign and in July

we supported 'The Southbrook Big Thank You' event. We now look forward to further community litter picks (see back page for more details), our Farmers Market event, Remembrance Day and the Christmas Market (see page 2).

At this point I would like to express my thanks to our amazing Town Council staff whose expertise, hard work and dedication have made the smooth transitions and events possible.

As Daventry continues to grow at pace, it is crucial that the Town Centre adapts to serve its residents. We must keep our eye on the ball and continue to ensure that the voices of Daventry's residents are heard whilst also ensuring Daventry continues to flourish.

DTC has raised the flag for various civic ceremonies, including the Queen's Birthday, held numerous community litter picks under the 'Daventry Litter Heroes' banner with the DTC Community Ranger, and supported the 'Southbrook Big Thank You Event' back in June. The bunting and hanging baskets have been put up, which we hope you will agree, make the town look lovely. The 'Sakura Cherry Tree Project' kindly donated 10 cherry trees that were planted in the New Street Park to mark 150 years of friendship with Japan. DTC were also lucky enough to be able to go ahead with the Spring Market in June, in-line with government guidelines, and even luckier that the sun shone all day. There were 43 independent stall holders filling the High Street with colours and smells that brought a great atmosphere to the town.

The next event is the Farmers' Market on Saturday the 18th September where once again there will be a diverse range of independent artisan food related stalls to tempt your tastebuds and get you creative in the kitchen.

A Spotlight on Entertainment & Science 18th May - 4th December 2021

This exciting exhibition has been inspired by the 150th anniversary of The Royal Albert Hall, London and explores an era full of wondrous scientific discoveries, theatre and entertainment.



Fascinating objects on display include examples of early motion picture such as the zoetrope and magic lantern, to an architectural model of a Victorian theatre, Victorian outfits, an extravagant, green fringed, theatre handbill and a pocket watch with tennis charms.

There's a free, fun family quiz and object hunt as well as a free peg doll making kit and craft book with templates for making your own Victorian puppet theatre for visitors to take home.

The exhibition is open Tuesdays - Fridays 9.30am - 1.30pm plus the first Saturday of the month 10am - 4pm.



Heritage Open Days: Edible England 10th - 18th September 2021

This year's Heritage Open Days' theme is 'Edible England' and the museum is celebrating with a new exhibit within the trader's exhibition area, exploring the town's culinary heritage and culture.



Displays will include old kitchen utensils such as butter pats, various moulds, food packaging, and some familiar cooking devices that are still in use today. Daventry Pubs and Inns will feature alongside photos from the archive of past food retailers and celebrations in the town.

The museum will also be sharing tips from wartime cookbooks and traditional Northamptonshire recipes.

The exhibition is open from the 10th - 18th September (Tuesdays - Fridays 9.30am - 1.30pm plus Saturday 18th from 10am-2pm).
