Local Government Association Peer Challenge – WNC

Last month's Town and Parish briefing made reference to the positive feedback received from this independent review. West Northants as a location in the centre of the country with a large range of businesses and low unemployment is described as having many advantages which would be the envy of other areas, including massive potential for economic and housing growth.

The briefing article did not include any of the eight recommendations on how services WNC provides could be improved. Among these recommendations are developing an overall vision for West Northants (partners are keen to work with the council but not yet clear of the new council's strategic ambitions and aims); developing a plan to manage medium to long term budget pressures (General Fund budget gap of £53.4m identified for 2025/26.. unclear how the council plans to tackle these budget gaps for future years): considering an overhaul of the website (difficult for customers and staff to navigate). The review also commented that town and parish councils as a collective group feel largely disconnected from the business of the new council and feel unable to bring influence on developments on the group, for example what will happen on transfer of assets. The annual report of WNC's external auditor has also made three key recommendations relating to significant weaknesses in the council's financial sustainability, its internal audit arrangements and financial statements. The auditor's view is that the council's financial reserves are low (the 10th lowest out of 58 unitary authorities) and should be increased to enable it to withstand any future financial shocks. WNC does not agree.

There is much interesting commentary in this report on how WNC provides adult and children's services and how it functions as a landlord and a planning authority. As regards expenditure, benchmarking shows that highways and transport spending is 17.7% higher than WNC's nearest neighbours and planning and development 40% more, while adult social care is 13.1% below its nearest neighbours. 


